

Advanced Surgical Techniques for the Rehabilitation of the Atrophic Maxilla: The Pterygoid Implant Solution

The pterygoid region provides an alternative anchoring point for implants in cases of highly resorbed maxillary ridges with insufficient bone volume. Pterygoid implants provide increased stability and support while eliminating the need for bone grafting procedures, which can simplify the overall treatment process. Pterygoid implants most often are placed using immediate loading protocols.

Minimize surgical complexity! Avoiding certain bone augmentation steps and utilizing alternative implant sites can contribute to a more straightforward and efficient treatment plan.
